

SHIPPING DANGEROUS GOODS AS AIRMAIL













Dangerous Goods, or Hazardous Materials, are solids, liquids, gases, articles or manufactured products which can harm people, animals, other living organisms, property or the environment.

The rules concerning Dangerous Goods in the mail are very restrictive. Other than in a very few specific circumstances, Dangerous Goods are not allowed in the mail. These rules apply to any airmail or courier sent internationally.

Dangerous Goods items that are prohibited in the mail include (but are not limited to):

- Aerosols
- Alcoholic Beverages
- Ammunition
- Bleach
- Corrosives
- Electronic Devices containing Lithium Batteries
- Explosives
- Fireworks
- Flammable Liquids
- Flammable Solids
- Flares
- Gases
- Matches
- Nail Polish and Nail Polish Removers
- Organic Peroxides
- Oxidizing Substances
- Paints
- Perfumes
- Poisons
- Solvents
- Toxic Substances
