GUIDANCE NOTES

Note 1 - Purpose of Flight(s)

Acceptance Flight - Flying the aircraft for customer acceptance usually before the aircraft is sold and/or registered/deregistered.

Ferry Flight for Maintenance - Flying the aircraft to a location where maintenance is to be performed, or to a place of storage.

Test Flight after Maintenance - Flying the aircraft following maintenance affecting the aircraft's performance, handling etc. or when required by the manufacturer.

Test Flight for Approval of a Modification - Flying the aircraft for the testing of modifications. Test flights must be made in accordance with a Flight Test Schedule approved by the state NAA certifying the modification(s).

Note 2 - Validity Period

The applicant should supply a validity period for the requested Special Flight Permit that allows enough time for the flight to be conducted. Special Flight Permits are usually issued for less than a month.

Note 3 - Special Flight Permit Release Certificate

Before conducting any flights the aircraft shall be inspected and repaired to the degree necessary to ensure safe flight, and a Special Flight Permit Release Certificate in accordance with OTAR 43.155 (b), shall be made in the aircraft log book by an appropriately rated maintenance organisation approved by the BCAA.
